1821: Michael Faraday demonstrated the first simple electric motor using a wire carrying an electric current that rotated around a magnet in mercury, known as the Faraday motor.

In 1835 the two Dutchmen Sibrandus Stratingh and Christopher Becker built an electric motor that powered a small model car. This is the first known practical application of an electric motor. In ...

History was made when Thomas Davenport of Vermont invented the first official battery-powered electric motor in 1834. This was the first electric motor that had enough power to perform a task and his ...

Michael Faraday created this model of his electric motor in 1822, a year after his discovery.
